To explore the potential origins of the SARS-COV-2, we conducted RNA-seq analysis using 27 SARS-CoV-2 positive environmental samples collected on January 1st, 2020 from the HSM. We analyzed the correlation of SARS-CoV-2 and the abundance of other species. The abundance of *Homo sapiens* showed the correlation to SARS-CoV-2 (Figure 4), which highly suggests the SARS-CoV-2 might have derived from *Homo sapiens* in the HSM. No animals were concluded, implying that no animal host of SARS-CoV-2 can be deduced.

But by March 2020, some Western virologists had staked their reputations on a wet market origin. "Prompted" by Fauci, they wrote a letter saying COVID was definitely natural.

Despite private doubts about the market.

The first is that it cryptically circulated in humans before evolving the furin cleavage site. The second is that it acquired a furin cleavage site in an intermediate host.

The first hypothesis is problematic because the clustering of early cases around the market implies that there was very little cryptic circulation in people.

"The connection to the market would be spurious – some doubt on that already," the notes read.

The second hypothesis requires a plausible intermediate host, the authors note.

"Can we suggest a host where this cleavage site would likely be advantageous. Ferrets/polecats? Rodents – bamboo rats (I don't know if they're popular in China)?" the notes read.

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

On February 25, Gao released a preprint supporting his earlier claim that the wet market was a superspreader event.

According to their sampling, COVID was most strongly correlated with human genetic material.

Among the ironies: The Western virologists didn't know that the more ancestral lineage of COVID was present in the market until they learned it from the Chinese preprint





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
